Date	# of Volunteers & Hrs.	What we were able to accomplish
11/20/12	25 volunteers 10: 00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. 200 volunteer hrs.	IRTC volunteers manned the phones at office, dealt with walk-in needs and off loaded food and supplies that was donated to for Super Storm Sandy victims. They were also able to make hundreds of packages to be distributed in the Canarsie area.
11/21/12	20 volunteers helping from 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. 160 volunteer hrs.	Received supplies from Occupy Sandy, stored in church and package for distribution. Walk in needs were taken care of. Partial cleaning of proposed warehouse was done.
11/22/12	15 volunteers helping from 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. 75 volunteer hrs.	Went to the Rockaways to register people who need immediately help cleaning out their houses focusing on the elderly first. We also took supplies and food to give to those who were unable to fetch it for themselves from a command center.
11/23/12	15 volunteers helping from 10:00 to 5pm. 105 volunteer hrs.	Volunteers met at the Command Center and much strategic planning was done to cook a Thanksgiving Dinner for the victims in the Canarsie area.

11/24/12	15 volunteers helping from 7 am to 5:00 pm. 150 volunteer hrs.	A group of 15 volunteers gathered at the Command Center, 846 Utica Avenue and prepared cook meals, turkey, chicken, (curried and barbequed) vegetables and rice. At approximately 2 pm food along with bagged packages, blankets and other form of clothing was taken to Canarsie and were delivered to the much deeded residents.
11/28/12	12 volunteers helping from 10 :00 am to 5 :00 pm 84 volunteer hrs.	Volunteers received and packaged items to be delivered at a later date.
